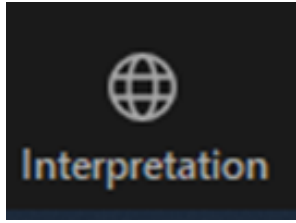

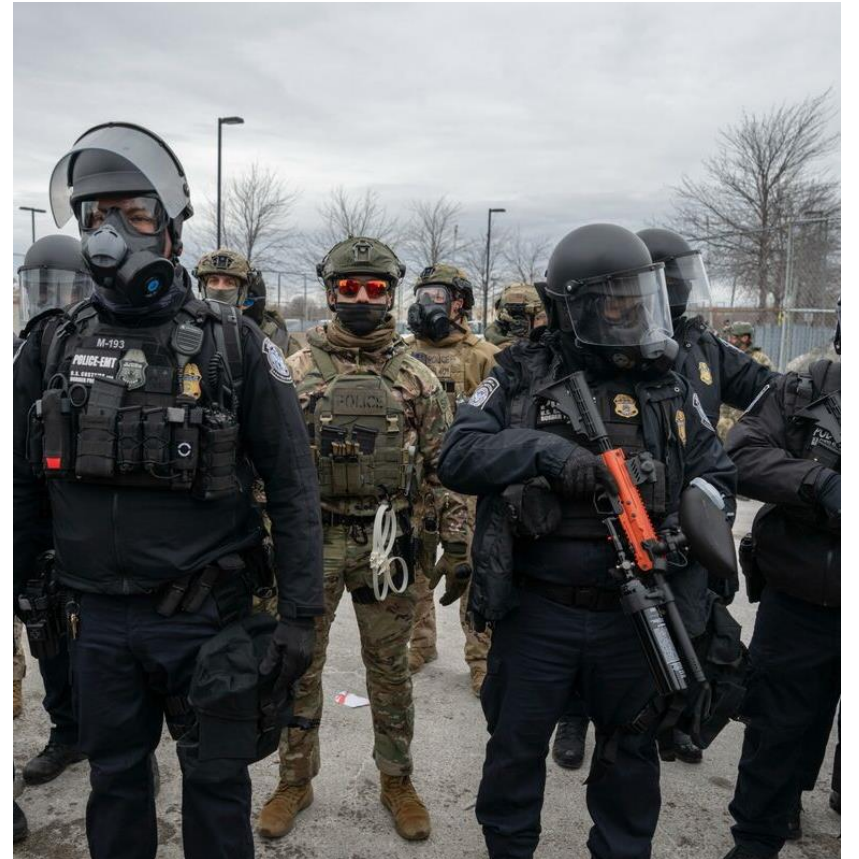
- Detention and deportation
- Blocking immigration and asylum
- Stripping legal status and citizenship
- Surveillance, control, and Intimidation

DETENTION & DEPORTATION

- **Massive expansion of deportations:** Over **390,000 people** deported in Trump's first year; ICE instructed to meet a **quota of 3,000 arrests per day**.
- **Escalation of enforcement tactics:** Raids now occur at **workplaces, schools, immigration courts, ICE check-ins, and community spaces**; widespread reports of masked agents, forceful arrests, tear gas, and property damage.
- **Rapid growth of detention:** Daily immigration detention population exceeds **60,000 people**, held in **makeshift camps, former military bases, private prisons, and federal prisons**, often with little oversight.
- **Deaths in custody:** At least **32 deaths in ICE custody** during Trump's first year.
- **Sensitive locations no longer protected:** Long-standing policy barring ICE from **schools, hospitals, and places of worship** has been rescinded.
- **Erosion of due process:** Roughly **100 immigration judges fired**, including at appellate levels, despite a growing case backlog.



BLOCKING IMMIGRATION & ASYLUM



- **Asylum effectively shut down:** National border emergency declared; border militarized; lawful asylum pathways eliminated through closure of **CBP One** and reinstatement of **Remain in Mexico**.
- **Refugee admissions largely suspended:** Program halted for all except **white Afrikaaners from South Africa**; thousands stranded worldwide, including **Afghans who assisted U.S. forces**.
- **Afghan ban & asylum freeze:** **All Afghan visas suspended indefinitely** after Dec. 2025 shooting; **all asylum decisions paused**, regardless of nationality.
- **Expanded travel bans:** **Full entry bans on 19 countries** and **partial restrictions on 20 more**.
- **Legal immigration pathways eliminated:** End of the **Diversity Visa Lottery (~50,000 visas/year)** and termination of **Family Reunification Parole**, dismantling family-based entry.

SURVEILLANCE, CONTROL & INTIMIDATION

- **Nationwide immigrant registry:**
 - Immigrants as **young as 14** required to submit fingerprints and personal data.
 - Non-citizens must carry proof of registration at all times, enabling **racial profiling**.
 - Historical parallels to **WWII-era registration and internment** of Japanese, German, and Italian communities.
- **Use of the Alien Enemies Act:** Deployed to **deport people without due process; hundreds transferred to prisons in El Salvador and elsewhere**, despite ongoing legal challenges.
- **Targeting sanctuary jurisdictions:** Federal funds threatened; **state and local officials criminally investigated** for refusing ICE cooperation.
- **Pressure on nonprofits:** Immigration-serving organizations face **funding cuts and prosecution threats**, undermining access to essential community services.

- Provide updates and resources on measures to protect immigrant communities from and/or mitigate the impact of current enforcement practices
- Identify gaps and areas of further need for the recently arrived and undocumented Latino community in Philadelphia

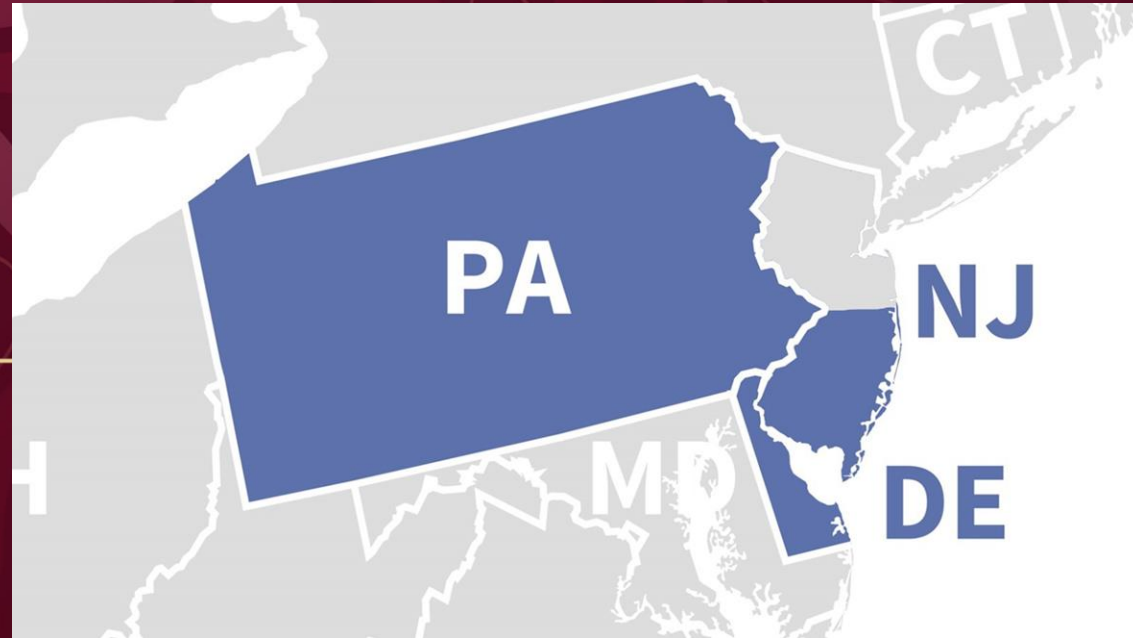

Conoce tus derechos en tu casa, lugar de trabajo o en la calle.

Si las autoridades migratorias llegan a tu casa:

- ▶ Mantén la calma y no abras la puerta.
- ▶ No huyas.
- ▶ No reveles tu situación migratoria.
- ▶ Pide la orden judicial de arresto y/o registro. Si la tienen, pide que la muestren por la ventana y revisa que tenga tu nombre, dirección y la firma del juez.
- ▶ Si no tienen una orden judicial, puedes negarles el acceso.

*Recuerda que una orden administrativa del ICE (forma I-200, I-205) no les da autorización para entrar a tu casa.

Si las autoridades te detienen:

- ▶ Guarda silencio.
- ▶ Pide hablar con el Consulado y no reveles tu situación migratoria.
- ▶ Comunícate con tu abogado.
- ▶ No firmes nada que no entiendas.
- ▶ Averigua qué agencia te arrestó (sheriff, departamento de policía local, ICE, patrulla fronteriza, etc.).
- ▶ Solicita un intérprete y una fianza.
- ▶ No mientas y no muestres documentos falsos.

Conoce tus Derechos

En caso de detención por cualquier autoridad, recuerda que tienes derecho a:

- ▶ Permanecer en silencio. Si te piden que te identifiques, sólo debes dar tu nombre. Di *"I want to remain silent"*.
- ▶ Expresar que no estás de acuerdo con que revisen tu persona, tu casa o tus pertenencias. Di *"I do not consent to a search"*.

Si te arrestan tienes derecho a:

- ▶ Solicitar un abogado. Di *"I want to speak to a lawyer"*.
- ▶ Realizar una llamada dentro de las primeras horas de arresto. Di *"I want to make a call"*.
- ▶ Comunicarte con tu consulado. Di *"I am a Mexican citizen and I want to speak to my consulate"*.
- ▶ No firmar ningún documento que no entiendas. Pide hablar con tu abogado. Di *"I refuse to sign any document. I want to speak to a lawyer"*.

Recuerda:

- ▶ Mantén la calma, obedece las indicaciones del oficial y actúa siempre con respeto.
- ▶ No opongas resistencia ni forcejees.
- ▶ No reveles tu situación migratoria.
- ▶ No muestres documentos falsos ni des información falsa.
- ▶ No conduzcas bajo la influencia del alcohol o drogas, sin licencia de conducir y sin seguro.



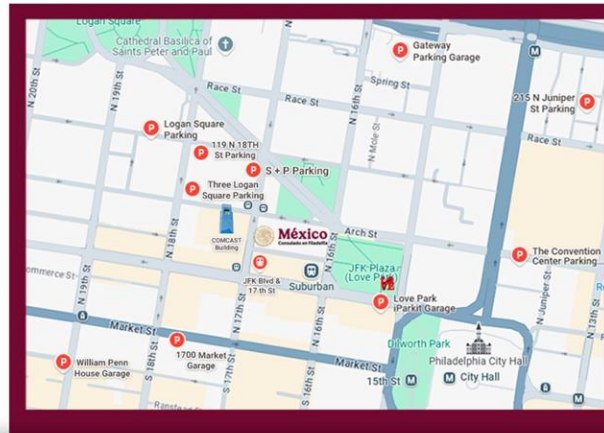

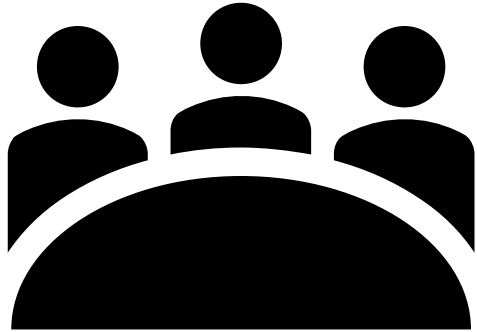

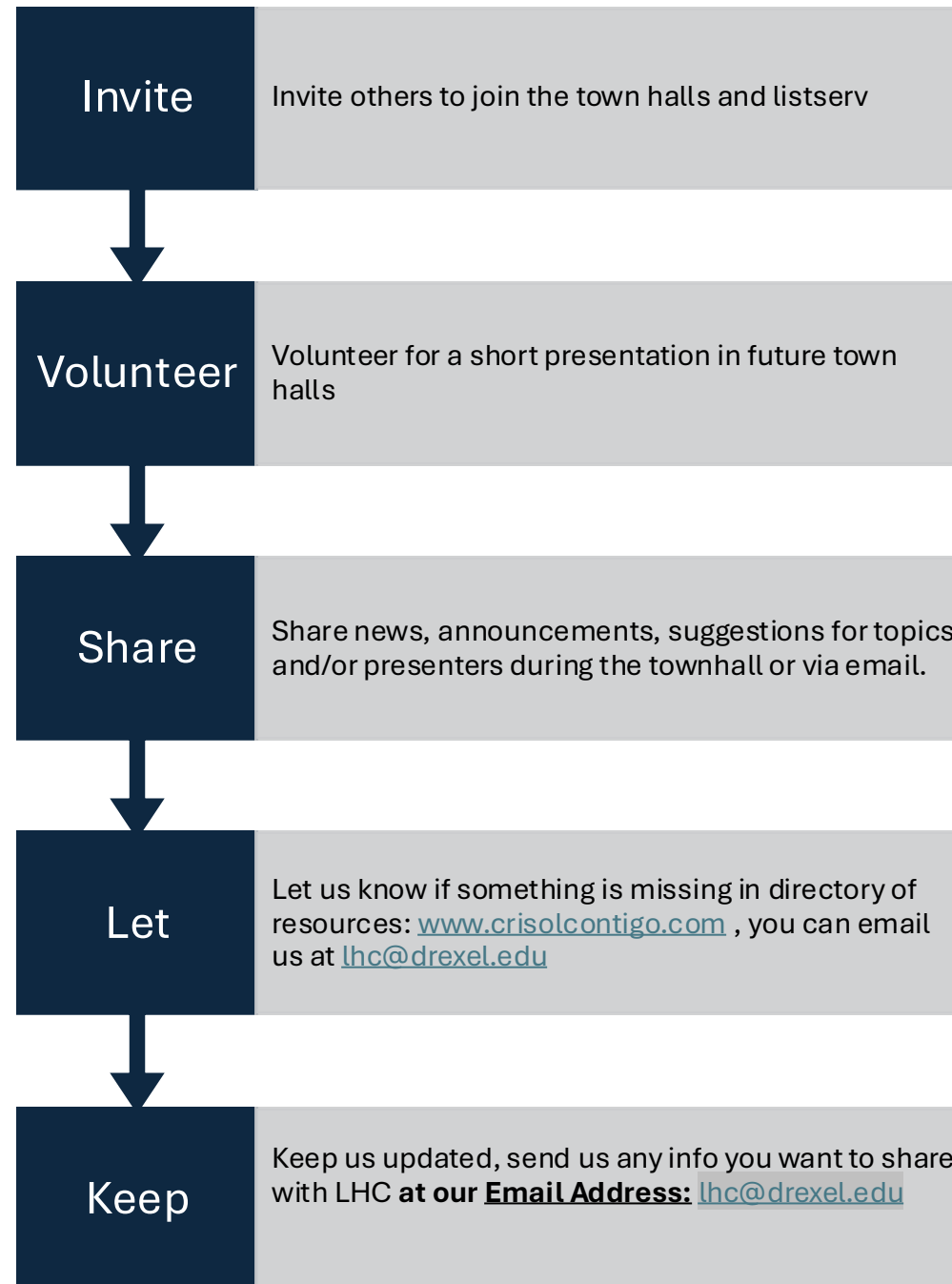
